
BEGINNING OF BEULAH CHURCH

The following statement is the first entry recorded in the Church Records and Minutes Book for Beulah Baptist Church.

"On January 1st 1898, Joe Bible and others decided to organize a Sunday school at Cain's School House, which proved a great success & grew steadily the whole year. The community taking a great interest in it. In Feby 1899 W.C. Hale of Morristown, Tenn. decided to hold a meeting which lasted ten days. The result-of which was a number of Conversions & 17 Baptized. Then a committee consisting of Joe Bible, F.P. McCorkle, & Wilburn Baker, was appointed to collect a fund sufficent to build a Church which amount was soon subscribed & on July 2nd 1899, the Church was organized."

AUTHOR'S NOTE: The land for the Church was given by Mrs. Fred (Eliza Jane McCurley) Scruggs. The land on which the church sits, had been given to Mrs. Scruggs by her parents John D. McCurley and Sarah J. (Neilson) McCurley. Mrs. McCurley had inherited the land from her father, Col. William D. Neilson. Col. Neilson, in turn, had been given the land by his own father, Hugh Douglas Neilson, a native of Ayreshire, Scotland. Hugh D. Neilson acquired the land from the State of North Carolina, by warrant on June 12, 1784, and was granted title to it, on November 17, 1790...almost six years before Tennessee became a state.

Mr. and Mrs. Fred Scruggs, Mr. and Mrs. John D. McCurley, Col. William D. Neilson, and Mr. Hugh Douglas Neilson, are all buried in the Neilson family cemetery, located on the McCorkle farm, about one mile from Beulah Baptist Church.





McCorkle and Wilburn Paker, Trustees' for the Paptist Church and acting on behair of and for the Paptist Church at Beulah, Greene County Tennessee, parties of the second part, WITNESSETH:-

That the said Mrs. E. J. Scruggs, of the first part, for and in consideration that the said second parties, as Trustees' contemplating du enc.

tion of a House of Worship on the premises herein after described, has granted bargained and conveyed and does hereby grant, bargain, give and convey unto the said parties of the second part, as Trustees' only, and for the usages and purposes of building a Church thereon only, the following described premises, to wit:

Beginning at a stake in Jas Wiscaver's and Scruggs line on the West edge of the road, and running N. 55 W. 20,1-2 poles to a stake, the original corner, S. 40,1-2 W. 8,2-5 poles to a stake; S. 53 E. 18,1-2 poles to a stake by the road; N. 54,1-2 E. (variation 3) 8,5-5 poles to the beginning, said to contain one acre, more or less, with the heraditiments and appertenances thereto apportaining.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, The said premises to the said parties of the second part and their successors in trust forever.

And James G. Rose, joins in this Deed for the sole purpose of waiving and releasing any rights he may have in and to the particular tract of land herein before described by virtue of a mortgage wherein he is beneficiary, executed by F. Scruggs and wife, on or about..... but not further or other wise.

ORGANIZATION OF BEULAH BAPTIST CHURCH

A Committe met, this the 2nd day of July 1899 at ten o'clock a.m. on the ground selected for the church. After a sermon by Rev. P.H.C. Hale, pastor of Concord Church, from Deut-1-19., Rev. W.C. Hale pastor of Warrensburg Church, was elected Moderator & Rev. W.C. Bayless, Missionary Colporter of the American Baptist Publication Society was elected Clerk.

The following Churches was represented by members present. Concord, Warrensburg, Rocky Pt., Morristown, Mossy Creek, Hebron, Catherine Nenny, Bethel, Whitesburg, & Owenton, Ky.

Letters of dismission were read as follows, from Warrensburg, James B. Murry (Murray), & wife Eva Murry (Murray), Wilburn Baker & sons Robt. B. Baker, Oscar W. Baker, Lawrence Talley & Joseph Talley, Jesse Edwards, Anice Edwards, Belle Mayfield, from Rocky. Pt., R.A. Lyle & wife Sallie Lyle, from Concord, W.B. Baker, Grace Baker, Ruth McCorkle, Katie Carmichael, Dorcas Talley, Media Talley, Shade Talley, Jr., Daisy Snowden. These twenty Brethen & Sisters resolved by Solemn vote, to consider themselves an independent Church. Then the Church Covenant & Articles of Faith, as set forth in Church Manual, by Rev. J.M. Pendleton, D.D., Pages 44.-63., were read and adopted.

The following persons were approved for Baptism, F.P. McCorkle & wife Mollie McCorkle and their two daughters Lena McCorkle, & Floy McCorkle, Jesse B. Baker.

A collection for Missions was taken which amounted to \$4.75 which amount was turned over to W.C. Hale .

Adjourned W.C. Hale Moderator

First session of Beulah Baptist Church after organization July 2nd 1899: The Beulah Baptist Church met for business, at 4 o'clock P.M., Rev. W.C. Hale acting as Moderator.

- 1 The name, Beulah, was chosen for the Church.
- 2 Rev. W.C. Hale was elected Pastor, by unanimous vote in acclimation.
- 3 Bro. F.P. McCorkle was elected Clk. & Treas.
- 4 Bro. Robt. A. Lyle being a Deacon in Rocky Pt. Church is set forth to serve in that capacity in Beulah Church.

- 5 The Candidates approved for Baptism in the fore noon, having been Baptized by W. C. Hale at three o'clock this eve., were given the hand of fellowship.
- 6 The fourth Sunday of each month was selected as the meeting day of the Church.

Adjourned W.C. Hale Moderator F. P. McCorkle, Clk

July 23rd 1899. The second meeting of the Beulah Baptist Church was held at Cain's School House, Rev. W. C. Hale of Morristown conducting the usual exercises. The reading lesson a part of 1st Chapter of Acts and 15th verse of John. Text Acts 1-8. After services a motion was made and carried, that Delegates be chosen to represent our Church at the Baptist association, Held at Buffalo, Grainger County, Tenn., also to present a petition to said association for admittance into its body. Delegates chosen F.P. McCorkle, Shade Talley, Jr., Willie Baker, also a committee consisting of F. P. McCorkle, Miss Dorcas Talley, and James D. Murry (Murray), was chosen to ascertain the amount this church was able to pay their Pastor.

Mission Collection 72 Cts. turned over to W. C. Hale

Aug. 27th 1899. The Third meeting of Beulah Baptist Church was held at Cains School House, Pastor conducting usual exercises, reading lesson, 11th Chapter Hebrews, Text 4th verse of same Chapter. After Sermon it was moved and carried that a letter of thanks be written to Mrs. Emma Snapp for her liberal contribution, a Bell for the Church. By unanimous vote W. C. Hale was chosen to deliver the Dedication Sermon. Also it was requested that our esteemed Brother Joe Bible, who has done so much for the Church, be allowed a voice in all business and religeous matters, pertaining to our Church and its welfare which request was unanimously adopted. The Collection for Missions amounted to 91 c. turned over to W. C. Hale as Treas for Missions.

Sept 24th 1899. The Beulah Baptist Church met at Cains School House. 4 o'clock P.M. Pastor W. C. Hale, conducting the exercises. Reading lesson 3rd Chapter of Rev. Text 3rd-8. After Sermon a Collection for Missions was taken amounting to 91 Cts. The amt was turned over to W. C. Hale Mission Treas.

New Church Building completed in October of 1899.

Dedication Sermon delivered by Pastor W. C. Hale, November 5th 1899.

New Church Organ bought and paid for, in May of 1900.

Charter Member and Deacon, Wilburn Baker, died in April of 1908.

Well known "Blacksmith Preacher" (Rev. Tom Sexton), held ten-day revival, in December of 1908.

Six New Members baptized in Lick Creek, on January 18, 1913.

Church Founder, Joe Bible, died in December of 1913.

Epidemic of "Spanish flu", mentioned in Church Minutes of February of 1919.

Greatest Revival in history of Beulah Church, held in February of 1927.

Baptism of new Church members from the great revival, held in March and April of 1927.

Long-time Church Clerk (30 years), F. P. (Pickens) McCorkle, died in April of 1929.

Church Minutes mention the blowing-up of Scoot Mill dam, in October of 1929.

Offering to Baptist Orphan's Home, during "Great Depression", November, 1930; mostly produce.

Long-time Deacon (42 years), J. F. (Finley) Wisecarver, died in December of 1943.

New Sunday School Rooms were dedicated in 1949; Rev. Johnny Poe was pastor.

Day of Prayer, requested by President Truman, held in May of 1945, when Germany surrendered.

New parsonage built in 1964-65: Rev. Robert Purkey was pastor.

Long-time Deacon (57 years), W. A. (Walter) Cooper, died in January of 1972.

Long-time Deacon (52 years), U. C. (Ulric) Bible, Sr., died in June of 1975.

New Fellowship Hall built in 1994; Rev. Steve Smith was pastor.

On July 2, 1999, Beulah Baptist Church will celebrate One Hundred Years in God's Service.

FIRST MEETING IN NEW CHURCH BUILDING

Nov. 5th 1899.

The Beulah Church met at 10:30 o'clock A.M. at the new Church. Our Pastor delivered the dedication sermon. The reading lesson can be found 1st Kings 8 Chapter. Text 1st Tim. 3rd Chapter a part of 15th verse. The Church of the living God, the Pillar and the ground of the truth. After the sermon a Collection was taken for the completion of the Church, amting to \$10.15, then a Collection was also taken for Missions amounting to \$13.80. The meeting was adjourned for Dinner, which was served on the Ground. A bountiful repast was served to about 2000 people. In the afternoon The Rev. M.D. Early_D.D. of Morristown Preached a most excellent sermon Text Jno 17-15. A third Collection was taken amounting to \$5.00 for Dr. Early's expenses.

NEW CHURCH ORGAN PAID FOR

May 26th 1900

The Church met at 3 o'clock P.M. Our Pastor W.C. Hale being present. The reading lesson will be found in the 6 Chapter of the Ephesians. Paul's Epistle to the Ephesians Text 10 verse of same Chapter. A motion was made and carried that our Church observe the Lord's Supper during our next meeting. Also it was mentioned that the \$75.00 organ bought by the Church had been paid for and a receipt was in hand for same.

JANUARY BAPTIZING IN LICK CREEK

Jan 5th 1913

A Series of meeting began in our Church, conducted by our Pastor, The Rev. J.M. Walters of Leadvale, Tenn. Two Services per day one in the Morning and one in Night, which continued until Jan 19th. The results was a great blessing to our Church and community. 23 Joined the Church & were approved for Baptism. 6 of the number were Baptized in Lick Creek, Below the Mill Jan 18th. Those who were Baptized were Della Quinn, Bessie Quinn, Grace Wisecarver, Selma Rader, Troy Rader & Willie Bowman, also Thos. Wisecarver joined by letter from Concord Church, also quite a Number were restored, and quite a lot of the Members reconsecrated their Service to God. & the Church. Also an offering was taken amting to \$31.10 from the Members and Congregatation, for the Pastor.

REVIVAL HELD BY "BLACKSMITH PREACHER"

AUTHOR'S NOTE: The following account is taken from the Church Minutes Book. Although not mentioned by name in the Church minutes, the "Blacksmith Preacher" was Rev. Tom Sexton, who was widely known throughout East Tennessee and surrounding areas.

Dec 5th 1908

The Church began a series of meetings on the night of Dec 5th. Our Pastor W. M. McGregor Preached. The next day The Blacksmith Preacher from Knoxville, began with two sermons per day which continued for ten days. The result of the meetings was 40 Saved and restored, also our Church was greatly revived, and many reconsecrated their lives to God. Also 8 were Baptised, namely Charley McCurley, Geo Guinn, Tom & Leonard Snowden, Mary McCorkle and Mary Potter, also Sallie and Liney (Lina) Edwards, 5 others was approved for Baptism. Our Pastor Preached for us on the night of the 20th. Read for his reading lesson the 5th Chapt Matt. Text was Rejoyce and be glad for Great is your reward in heaven. He also offered his resignation to the Church having Prayed over the matter felt-it-best to resign, a collection was taken amting to \$3.47 for Missions.

CHURCH RESOLUTION CONCERNING THE DEATH OF JOE BIBLE

February 1st 1914

We the Committee, representing Beulah Church and named to draft a few words of tribute to the name and memory of our late friend and brother Joseph Bible submit that, ___Brother Bible departed this life at Greeneville, Tenn. on the night of Dec.31st _1913. Whereas Brother Bible was a member of the Baptist Church at Warrensburg __Yet he had done so much for Beulah and its church and people, and in fact was recognized as the very Father and corner stone. so to speak, of our beloved church __We claim him as one of our own, in fact he was one of us "unanamously elected as an honorary member __with all the privileges of a full member. W&Mc." (initials of J.F. Wisecarver and F.P. McCorkle). Yea verily a leader of us in all that pertained to God and His Kingdom and one can but feel that our greatest eulogy but poorly expresses this man of God and this great loss that our Church and people have sustained, Therefore--Resolved

That we realize in the death of Brother Joe Bible the loss not only of a dear friend, but of our most tireless worker for God and His Kingdom and a most devoted and lovable Brother in our Church. That Brother Hale could have found no more approiate verse for the very sad funeral services than the one he read Gens. 5-22 "Enoch walked with God" Brother Bible was truly a man that "walked with God" a man of ceaseless energies and activities in the cause of Christ and His Kingdom. We realize that the living active monuments of faithful work, he left behind him, speak louder and will live longer than any glowing words or marble shaft could ever commerate.

Our own dear Beulah Church would likely never have been, but for the heart and hand of Brother Bible. The Warrensburg Church; and his last great work__but not the least__the splendid school building at Warrensburg lately completed, and many others we could name, are all living active monuments that speak in mighty power and splendor of brother Bible's great work for his people and for the advancement of Christ's Kingdom.

Brothers and Sisters we will not soon or easily find a man to fill brother Bible's place___We can only ask God to help us in a measure supply the great loss, and thank God always that such a noble and truly good man lived and worked with us; and take his name and blessed deeds as an inspiration to help us along the way. Let us unite our hearts and hands in our great effort to carry on the work so nobly begun.

AUTHORS NOTE: A similar resolution was adopted by the Sunday School at Beulah Church, as a tribute to Mr. Joe Bible. It was written by Mrs. F.P. McCorkle, and read on February 1, 1914, by her daughter Willie.

Although Mr. Joe Bible was the actual founder of Beulah Church, and an active participant in all affairs of Beulah Church, and the Sunday School Superintendent for the first fourteen years of the church; he remained a member at Warrensburg Baptist Church, until his death. He was however, an honorary member of Beulah Baptist Church; an honor bestowed upon him by a unanimous resolution adopted by the church.

FLU EPIDEMIC OF THE WINTER OF 1918-1919

Feb 16th 1919

Services was omitted on account of sickness in the Country Neighborhood in form of "Spanish Flu", which was quite an epidemic.

BEULAH'S GREAT REVIVAL OF 1927

Feby 19th 1927

Then began a series of meetings in our Church, Conducted by the Pastor Rev. Walter Overholt, assisted by the Rev. W.M. McGregor of Bulls Gap, Tenn. The result of these meeting was a great Blessing to our Community and the consecration of the members to the Service of the Lord. Also in these meetings the Power of the Spirit was the Greatest in the history of this Church. The members restored with new Professions and approved for Baptism was 58 Also 10 joined by letter. The song service was ably conducted by Mr. Walter Jones, "a member", assisted by other members and Kind Neighbors. These meetings continued for a period of Sixteen days.

BAPTISIMS IN MARCH AND APRIL OF 1927

THE FIRST BAPTISMS TOOK PLACE ON MARCH 20, 1927. THE SECOND GROUP WERE BAPTIZED ON APRIL 17, 1927. BOTH GROUPS WERE BAPTIZED IN LICK CREEK, NEAR HARMON'S MILL, JUST ABOVE THE SCOOT BRIDGE. AT OTHER TIMES BEULAH CHURCH PASTORS USED THE NOLICHUCKEY RIVER, ON THE REPS JONES FARM, NEARER THE CHURCH, FOR BAPTIZING. WATER LEVEL PROBABLY DETERMINED THE LOCATION.

March 20th 1927

The Church again met with the Pastor at 11 o'clock. He read for His lesson the 1st Chapt. Acts, and Preached a Soul Stirring Sermon from the 8th verse. Text was Power from God. The Congregation all enjoyed the Sermon. At 2:30 o'clock the greatest number of People that was ever gathered to witness the Second Ordinance of Baptism, Typical of the death, burial & ressurection of our Savior gathered at the Bridge near the Harmon Mill, on Lick Creek. 42 Sought this watery Grave, and came out of the water rejoicing in observance to our Lord's Command. There were 52 additions to the Church 52 more voices to sing His praises & be filled with messages for Him. 52 more Hands to do His work and that many feet to walk His way. At 6:30 the Church gathered with the Baptist Young Peoples's Union who Had such a nice Program. Everyone learned & enjoy it so much, after which the Pastor read for His evening lesson the 2nd Chapt Jno and preached one of His greatest and most Spirital Sermons, on Loveth thou Me. After the Sermon the right Hand of fellowship was extended to the 52 New Members. Also notice was given to the New Members approved for Baptism to be ready the next regular meeting.

April 17th 1927

The Church met at 11 o'clock with our Pastor. He read a part of the 24th Chapt Matt for the reading lesson and Preached a great Sermon on the Second Coming of Christ. Watch then for ye know not what hour your Lord doth come. 42nd verse of above Chapt. At 2 o'clock the Church gathered together again

at the Bridge, near the Mill on Lick Creek, joined by the Billy Sunday Club of Morristown who conducted the Services. The Ordinance of Baptism was administered to 6 by the Pastor. The Six were Ralph Wisecarver, Jack Atchley, Glenn Wisecarver, Mrs. Flora Atchley, Miss Frost Luster and Mrs Laura Jackson. After the Baptising, the Church went to the Meeting House, with the Billy Sunday Club who gave a Splendid Program enjoyed by a full House with good Singing and Spiritual talks & Prayers. The result was one profession, also Church letters was read, and 4 additions by letter, namely Mrs. Roberta Wisecarver, Miss Artie Wilkerson, Mrs. Stella Kesterson and Conley Sea (Seay). The right Hand of fellowship was extended to all the Christian People by the Billy Sunday Club. Also all the Christian people gave the right Hand of fellowship to the 10 New Members. This was one of the most enjoyable meetings in the History of our Church.



NOTES FROM THE YEARS OF THE GREAT DEPRESSION

AUTIIORS NOTE: Sometimes events of community interest, while not strictly church business, were noted in the Church Minutes Books. The last sentence of the following entry is such an example.

October 13, 1929,

" At 2:30 o'clock P.M. this church met to hear Dr. Arthur Fox of Morristown. He preached an intensely interesting sermon from 3rd Chapter of Malachi. Bring Ye the tithes into the storehouse, that there may be meat in mine house--a duty and privilege with the blessings of God promised. He said 'God will do nothing for me that I can do for myself.' Owing to the great calamity that had befallen our neighbor, Mr. Neil Harmon in the blowing up of his mill dam the night before, the attendance was not large, but all were deeply interested."

AUTHORS NOTE: The following entry in the Beulah Church Minutes Book reflects the hard times that were felt across our country, in the years after the "Great Depression" began in the fall of 1929. While "hard cash" was a scarce commodity at the time, the members of Beulah Baptist Church managed to gather an offering for the Baptist Orphan's Home.

November 3, 1930

" A report was given of gifts sent by Beulah Church to our Orphan's Home. Corn 36 and one-half bushels, 2 bushels oats, 1 bushel potatos, one-half bushel turnips, 10 pounds lard, 6 pumpkins, 102 cans fruit, fifty of it sweets, 3 pairs hose, 6 quilts. Cash \$3.00.

THE WORLD WAR TWO YEARS

AUTHORS NOTE: The last entry in the second Church Minutes Book, reflects the sadness felt by the Church and the community, in the loss of long-time deacon and Sunday School superintendent, Mr. J. F. (Finley) Wisecarver. Mr. Wisecarver had served as a deacon since October 27, 1901. He was loved by the entire community.

December 19, 1943

"On Tuesday night Dec. 14th, Mr. Finley Wisecarver one of our most beloved Members, and a deacon, former superintendent, and teacher passed away. He will be missed in our Church by all."

AUTHOR'S NOTE: World War II was probably the single most significant event of the twentieth century. Like families everywhere across the land, the "boys from Beulah Church" answered their country's call. Nine young men who were members of Beulah Church, served in the armed forces. The Church still has the small home-made flag with their names stitched in on individual stars. The flag also included the names of fifteen other young men from the community. It was created by the ladies of the church in rememberance of those boys.

The following entry made by church clerk, Mrs. Kyle Everhart, reflects the relief and thanksgiving felt by the entire nation, upon the surrender of Germany in May of 1945.

May 13, 1945

"Beulah Church met on Sunday morning May 13th, for the regular service. Our Pastor just gave us a short talk and the time was spent in prayer as requested by President Truman on this day."

AUTHOR's NOTE: The Pastor who served at Beulah Baptist Church from October 6, 1906, to December 5, 1908, and again from March 2, 1912 to April 27, 1912, is always identified in the Church Records of that period, as "Rev. W.M. McGregor." In my opinion, he was in fact...Rev. W. E. McGregor. His name was William Edward McGregor.

When he returned to Beulah Baptist Church for the third period of service from April 8, 1933, to July 14, 1946, he was properly listed in the Church Records as Rev. W. E. McGregor. It is thought that the mistaken entry in the earlier records came about by the common usage of the abbreviation "Wm" for the name William. At least one other church served by Rev. McGregor, made the same error. He is listed as two different men, in their church history.

This error was corrected through the help of the ninety-year old widow of Rev. John McGregor, who was the son of Rev. W.E. McGregor. She told the author that the maiden name of the wife of Rev. W.E. McGregor, was "Rutledge"....and that Rev. McGregor was a native of the Sequatchie Valley area, west of Chattanooga. It can be found in the Church Records book for Beulah Baptist Church, that on October 26, 1907, and on December 21, 1907, that the Rev. W.B. Rutledge of Pikeville, Tennessee, filled the place of "Pastor W.M. McGregor." Mrs. John McGregor identifed this man as her late husband's grandfather....and the father-in-law of Rev. W.E. McGregor. This seems to be conclusive proof that "W.M. McGregor" and W. E. McGregor, were one and the same man.



In May of 1943, shortly before the second Minute Book was closed, a committee consisting of Rev. W. E. McGregor, Mrs. Lillie Luster, Mr. & Mrs. W.A. Cooper, Mrs. Kyle Everhart, and U.C. Bible, found that the church had 69 active members.

Over the past one hundred years, many marriages have taken place between families who are... or have been... members of Beulah Baptist Church. There have also been occasions where families or individuals have moved their church letter to other churches, and then later moved back to Beulah Church. For this reason there are sometimes instances when the same person's name appears on the accumulated church records, several times... sometimes under a maiden name... and later a married name. It has been the goal in this booklet, to show the earliest membership at Beulah Church, for each person listed. In working with multiple name entries in several church minutes books, it has been difficult to make certain that every member has been listed... but no one listed more than once. Please accept the advance apologies from the compiler of this material for any errors or omissions that may have inadvertently occurred.

SOME FACTS ABOUT BEULAH BAPTIST CHURCH

Rev. W. E. McGregor was the longest-serving pastor; a total of 15 years.

Mr. F.P. (Pickens) McCorkle, served the longest as church clerk; 30 years.

Mr. W. A. (Walter) Cooper served the longest as deacon; 57 years.

The greatest revival in the history of the Church was in February, 1927.

Mrs. Kyle (Blanche) Everhart was only lady S.S. Superintendent in 1943.

New Sunday School rooms dedicated in 1949; Rev. Johnny Poe was pastor.

Church services moved from Saturday night to Sunday night, in 1947.

Church went to half-time preaching in 1947. Rev. M. V. Hoover was pastor.


Full-time preaching restored in November, 1957. Rev. Ted Peace was pastor.

Parsonage was completed in 1964-65; Rev. Robert Purkey was pastor.

New Fellowship Hall was built in 1994; Rev. Steve Smith was pastor.

BEULAH'S WW II FLAG OF REMEMBERANCE



The red, white and blue flag shown here, was created by the ladies of Beulah Baptist Church during World War II, in honor of the nine young men from Beulah Baptist Church, and the fifteen others from the Beulah-Scoot-McDonald Community, who were serving their country. All twenty-four of those young men survived the war. Less than half are now alive.

At least one of the ladies of the church who helped sew the stars, and the names of the young men on the flag, still recalls working on the project fifty-five years ago. Of the "nine boys from Beulah".....one of them waded ashore with the U.S. First Infantry Division at Normandy's Omaha Beach on D-Day, one was wounded in the Battle of Leyte Gulf, one guarded the hospital room of Gen. George S. Patton....and one left the Navy as a Rear Admiral, in command of a fleet of warships. They *all* served their country with dedication, distinction, and pride, and brought honor to their church, their families, and to their rural community.
